

CV Johannes Karcher

Mr. Karcher is head of the patent division of the Federal Ministry of Justice in Berlin, Germany. He is also heading the Ministry's project team "EU-Patent and Unified Patent Court. He represents Germany in a range of international bodies, including the working groups of the Council of the European Union, the European Patent Organization and the Preparatory Committee for the Unified Patent Court. He is the Coordinator of the Legal Working Group of the Preparatory Committee for the Unified Patent Court and deputy Chairman of the Committee on Patent Law of the European Patent Organization. He was responsible for the negotiations of the Agreement on a Unified Patent Court and the EU regulations no. 1257 and 1260/2012 implementing enhanced cooperation in the area of unitary patent protection.

After passing his High School Diploma in the United States and his *Abitur* in Germany, Mr. Karcher studied law at Kiel University (first state examination in law in 1995) and at Bordeaux University I (*Licencié en Droit* in 1991). Subsequently, he completed his preparatory service, including placements at the Federal Constitutional Court in Karlsruhe and the Germany Embassy in London (second state examination in law in 1997). Starting in 1997, he has served as a judge, initially at a Court of first instance (Amtsgericht) and later on at the Court of Appeal (Oberlandesgericht Schleswig). In 2009 he became judge at the Federal Patent Court (Bundespateamtgericht) in Munich. From 2001 to 2004, Mr. Karcher served as national expert to the EU Commission in Brussels, Directorate General for the Internal Market, for the proposal of a regulation on the Community patent where he was also responsible for the 2003 proposals on the establishment of a Community patent court as part of the European Court of Justice.
